EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE UNITED STATES BOARD OF MEDIATION

STATEMENT REGARDING WORK OF THE BOARD

On June 21, 1934, by the passage of Public, No. 442, Seventy-third Congress, amendments to the Railway Labor Act, the United States Board of Mediation, consisting of 5 members, was abolished as of July 21, 1934, and there was created the National Mediation Board, consisting of 3 members.

The United States Board of Mediation for the fiscal year 1933-34

received and disposed of cases as follows:

New cases received, 569, which number was 62 more than in any preceding year.

Cases disposed of, 610, or 171 more than in any preceding

year.

There remained on the open docket as of June 30, 1934, 317 cases, a decrease of 40 cases as compared with the open docket June 30, 1933.

There were no strikes in the railroad industry during the year covered by this report.

ARBITRATION BOARDS

During the past year 13 agreements to arbitrate were established through the service of the Board of Mediation. Six arbitration proceedings were held and awards made; one arbitration agreement was withdrawn by the parties. In the remaining six instances arbitration proceedings had not been started or awards had not been made.

EMERGENCY BOARDS

Proclamations were issued and emergency boards were appointed by the President, under the provisions of section 10 of the Railway Labor Act, to investigate and report respecting unadjusted disputes as follows:

The terms of office (except in case of vacancy occurring) are for 5 years, one board member being appointed each year. The Board annually designates one of its members to act as chairman.


